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Pupil Premium Allocation and Spending 2017-8

The Department for Education allocated a specific pupil premium grant to every school to enhance the educational opportunities of students that are entitled to Free School Meals (FSM) or have been at any point in the last 6 years (Ever 6FSM), Looked After Children (LAC) and children of service families (Ever 5 Service). This amounts to £935 per FSM or Ever 6FSM student, £1900 per LAC student & £300 per Ever Service student, Qualifying students in January 2016 resulted in a grant of £206,540.00. Expenditure plan as follows:

4. Funding for school transport for families in difficult financial circumstances and to support attendance to sessions before and after school	£25,000	Improved attendance
5. iPad leasing scheme for disadvantaged students	£10,000	No child disadvantaged by a lack of key equipment
6. Staffing salaries including two pupil premium mentors (KS3 and KS4), English and Maths intervention teachers, pastoral support staff, learning support staff, career and guidance staff	£105,000	Improved outcomes for PP students as measured by external exam results, attendance and sustained destination
7. Funding for enrichment opportunities (music, drama, sport, trips and visits)	£15,000	Equality of opportunity for potentially life changing visits
8. Financial support for uniform & specialist school wear	£1,000	No child disadvantaged by a lack of key equipment
9. CPD for staff	£10,000	Improved teaching for all disadvantaged students in every classroom.
