## Maths

Congratulations to all the students from years 9, 10 and 11 who took part in the UKMT Intermediate Maths Challenge. Five of

our Year 11 even qualified for the next stage, the Pink Kangaroo, which took place in school on Thursday 16 March. Well done to them!

This half term included a very special maths date - March 14. This is a significant date because if we look at the digits of the date, we get 3.14, which are the first three digits of  $\pi$  (the ratio of the circumference and the



diameter of a circle).

Therefore, March 14 is known as Pi-day, and to celebrate this, many lessons included a range of related problems. Students in some classes were challenged to memorise as many digits of  $\pi$  as they could; other students took part in a Pi-day relay race and some completed a Pi-day Quizizz, there were even Pi Dingbats!

Mr Black set some of his groups a tricky problem about the cost of DIY earrings that were created from parts of circles, which they needed to use the formula for the area of circles (=  $\pi r^2$ ) to solve.
