












Get ready to 'click those fingers', this year's Conyers School performance is THE ADDAMS FAMILY, a comical feast that embraces the wackiness in every family.

This provides a safe and confidential space for those who may have caregiving roles to seek further support. We encourage everyone in our school community to keep the conversation going and stay aware of the issues raised in this assembly.
